Here's a brief description of our club's goals, projects, and interest:

The OHGC was started by a group of women in 1923 who wanted to preserve a park containing a large stand of Garry oaks that was threatened with removal. Since then, its goal has been to beautify Oak Harbor by planting and maintaining small areas in the city.

OHGC has something for everyone and is made up of both men and women who enjoy the many activities and projects in which we participate. Our monthly meetings have horticulture displays of specimens from members' gardens, talks by our own horticultural expert, floral design programs and a talk given by an expert in a subject such as gardening, environmental issues, landscaping, etc. We participate in community beautification, junior gardeners, a yearly plant sale, a garden tour and tea, and holiday wreath sales to name a few.

We have an extensive library on site of books on horticulture, floral design and environmental issues available for members to check out. We have a monthly Hospitality Committee who provide refreshments for members using biodegradable products and a Country Store where members can purchase other members' items. Items not sold are donated to area thrift stores.

We are an inclusive group who welcome all who are interested in our goals. We are affiliated with the Washington State Federation of Garden Clubs, Pacific Region Garden Clubs and the National Garden Club. We are a 501(c)3 organization.
